SAPIRO MAKES ERROR IN HIS TESTIMONY

Ford's Attorneys Score Repeatedly, After Losing Important Point

DETROIT, April 6.—Aaron Sapiro, his own perfect witness despite the withering fire of Senator James A. Reed's seven days of cross-examination, finally has made a mistake in the million dollar Ford-Sapiro libel suit.

The Jewish attorney who is suing Henry Ford for libel growing out of the Dearborn Independent's articles concerning Sapiro and his farmers' cooperatives activities, denied Tuesday morning that he had ever received fees from the United States Grain corporation. But several hours later, when the wily senator from Missouri again brought up the subject, Sapiro admitted he was in error.

After losing one decision in the morning, regarding evidence he might introduce, Reed who is of the billionaire's counsel, repeatedly scored in the afternoon session of federal court here.

It was the most hotly contested session in a week. The plaintiff and his attorney, William Henry Gallagher, repeatedly clabbed. Pecking away in his slow, deliberate manner, Reed tried to show that Sapiro maliciously attempted to wreck the American Farm Bureau federation, because it refused to employ him.

The witness denied the charge. The defense point was that Sapiro was trying to force his services upon the bureau. It was still being argued when court adjourned.

Indications were that Sapiro's cross examination and redirect testimony probably would not be completed this week.

ASSESSORS MAY NOT USE HATED BLANKS

State Tax Commission Leaves it to Each Individual Official

SALEM, April 6.—(AP)—The protested "blue blank" designed for use in assessing property in Oregon was abandoned by the

state tax commission today.

Reputation was not direct but results will be practically to that end. The commission adopted a resolution which placed the matter of using the blank up to the county assessors who may or may not use it, as they see fit.

Two clubs, by which improvement in assessments may be attained were reserved by the commission. One is a penalty provided in the new assessment law for falsifying information given assessors. The other is the power granted the commission by

the new law in permitting that body to go into any county and reassess if it is believed a proper assessment was not made by the county assessor. Commissioner Earl Fisher protested the resolution which leaves use of the questionnaire to the discretion of the county assessors.

Thomas B. Kay, state treasurer denied that use of the blank was necessary and Governor I. L. Patterson said he had never been the "blue blank" before it was broadcast over the state.
