**200 MILES AN HOUR SHIP INVENTED BY BOSTON MAN**

**BOSTON - (LP) - Plans for a warship capable of a maximum speed of 200 miles an hour have been submitted to the U. S. Patent Office by William Vincent Pruscino, Boston inventor.**

**The amazing speed which Pruscino believes possible would be obtained by incorporating certain principles of airplane and submarine construction in a craft designed to glide over the water's surface.**

**Equipped with air as well as water propellers, an almost flat-bottomed boat is the basis of Pruscino's plan. Airplane wings would exert a lifting force.**

**The inventor believes the idea might be extended to commercial navigation. He has discussed the plan with Massachusetts Institute of Technology engineers and hopes to interest them in the project.**

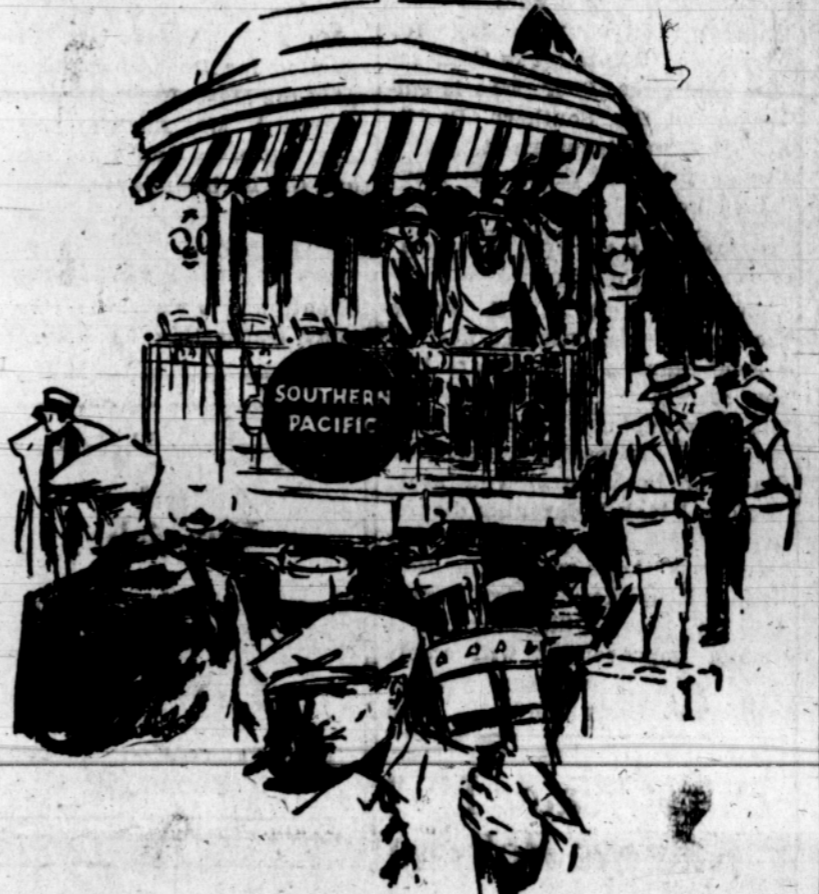
