**Further Change**  
A further change in the method of raising revenue which was strongly pressed on the Chancellor of the Exchequer last fall related to a proposal to change the present method of taxing automobiles on the basis of 1 pound per horse-power to a petrol tax of 6 pence per gallon, similar to the tax used in many sections of the United States. It is understood, however, he is opposed to making the change, at any rate during the current year, and that this change will not be a feature of the new budget.
