Wm. Schaumlöffel and little daughter left Saturday for a visit.

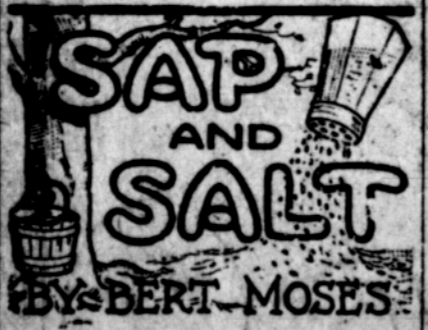
ASHLAND 30 Years Ago
