advisable for the administration to prepare a new farm bill that would appeal to the McNary-Haugen group.

The administration bill, Fess explained Thursday, is a compromise which goes further than the original loan plan which stops short of the equalization fee scheme in the old McNary bill, which the president believed to be unsound and which caused his recent veto.

The plan now under discussion, while incomplete is based on the principle of loaning government money at low interest enabling storing of crops and feeding them into the market gradually, holding up the price by preventing a glut at harvest time.

McNary is for it and Fess believes that it will be generally acceptable.
