ATTEMPT PHOTOGRAPH SKY IS DIFFICULT JOB

has finished this part of the work and recently took over the other half of Santiago's share.

The three observatories, which are furthest behind are Potsdam, Germany, Sydney, Australia and Tacubaya, Mexico. It is possible that part of Potsdam's work will be transferred to the Belgian Observatory at Uccle.

Great Map

The purpose of the great map, or Astrographic Chart as it is called, is to give accurate positions of all of the brighter stars in the sky, including those visible with a three-inch telescope. Another purpose is to give a close estimate of the brightness of these stars in order that future changes in the sky can be noted accurately.

It is contended that the completion of this chart will assist in investigating the distribution of the stars through space and in arriving at a more accurate knowledge of the form and structure of the universe.

The number of charts necessary to cover the whole sky is considerably over 20,000 and each of these 20,000 plates is exposed three times, so that each star is represented by three closely approximated points in order that they may not be mistaken for photo-

In addition several other plates are exposed several times in each of the 20,000 star fields to measure the brightness of the stars, thus making about 200,000 separate exposures.

Another part of the task is the measurement and calculation of brightness and position from the plates of nearly 9,000,000 stars. These calculations are made twice to avoid errors.

"Life imprisonment is much better. It protects society just as well, or better. It makes conviction much more certain. It has been tried in many places and found successful. And it decreases the harm when innocent men are convicted."
