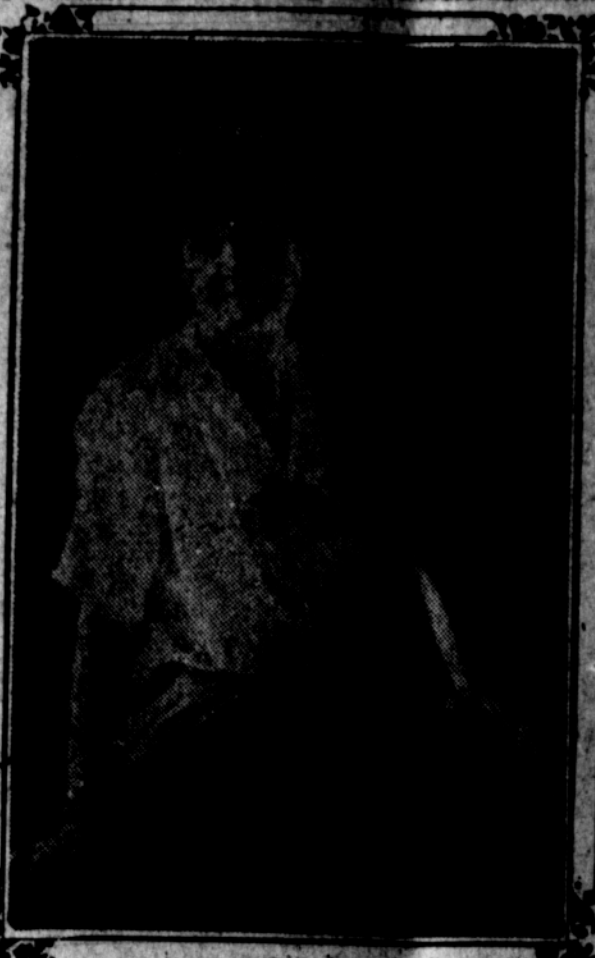
Mr. and Mrs. A. R. Kincaid and family spent Sunday at the Hamaker home on Green Spring.

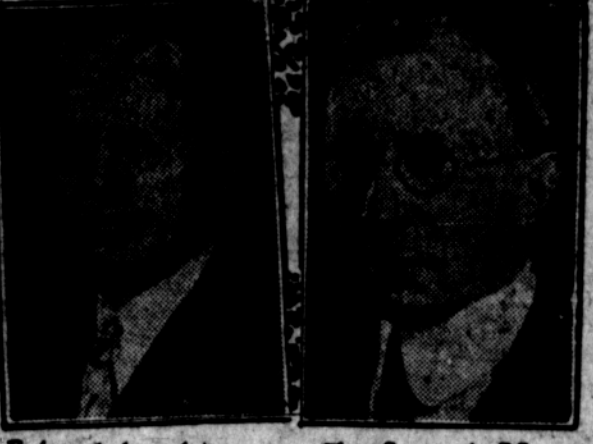

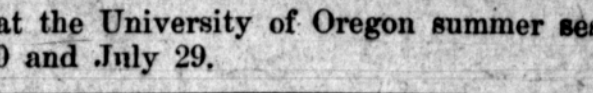

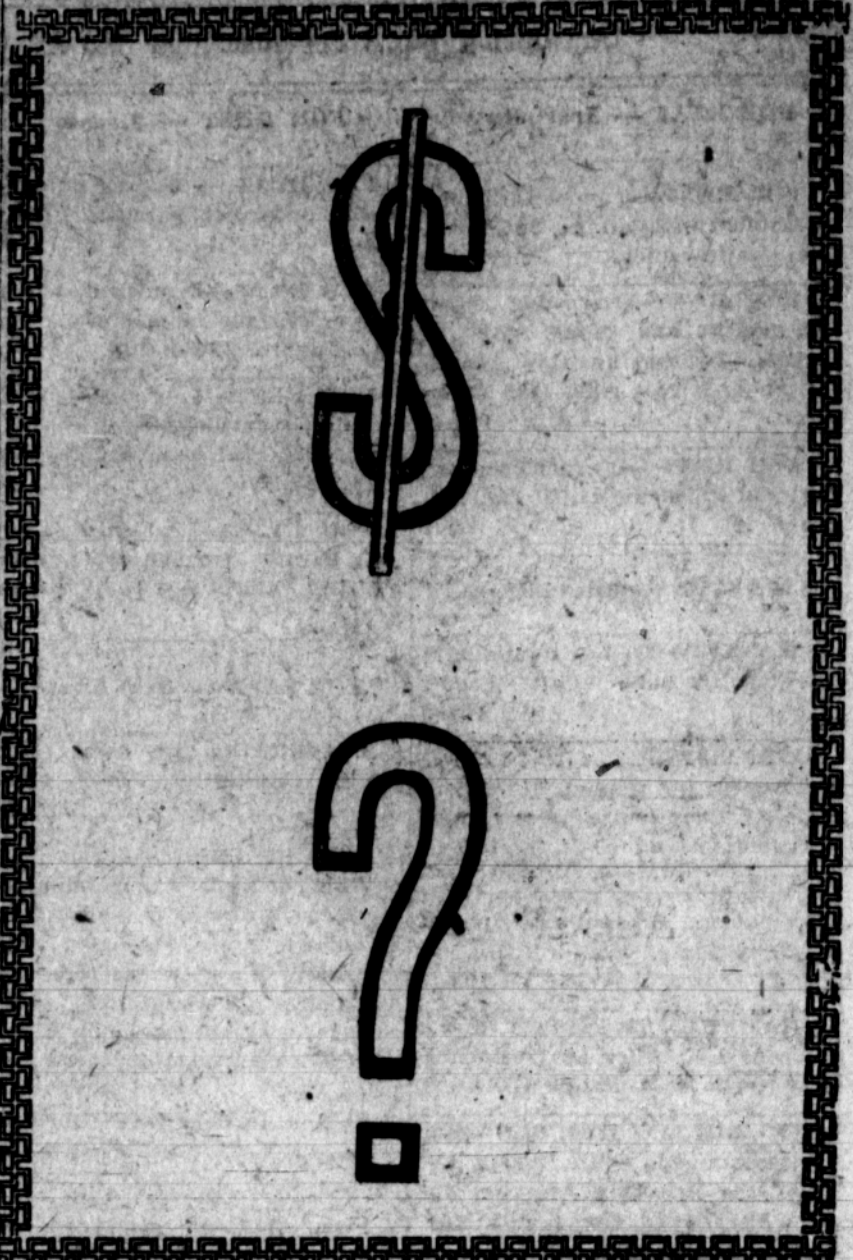
