

### COUNTY HEALTH NOTES

Tuberculosis and goiter is receiving extra close attention in this county at the present time with state and national specialists concentrating on the problems.

On April 29 and 30 there will be a free clinic for persons suspected of having tuberculosis rather than the tubercular patients themselves who have been to former clinics or whose condition is well known by their physicians or public health nurses. An effort is always made by the nurses and county health officer to look after persons who come in contact with a tubercular patient or who complain of a chronic cough, cold or other suspicious symptom of tuberculosis, so this clinic is a result of months of planning and rounding up of "suspects". Dr. Chas. Rogers of Portland will be the specialist in attendance with the County Health Unit and Public Health Association assisting with transportation, expenses, etc. The Medford Center Bldg., third floor is the location selected as there will be a Fluoroscope there available for thorough examinations.

Appointments for the clinic must be made in advance with the Jackson County Health Unit in the Court House, telephone Jacksonville 491.

Dr. Rogers has been recommended for this important service by the State Tuberculosis Association and by Dr. G. C. Bellinger of the State Sanitarium who has been the expert at these clinics in the past, but is busy planning the Eastern Oregon Tuberculosis Hospital at present along with his regular duties.

Tuberculosis claimed 518 deaths in Oregon last year which means one death every 16 hours but that is a decline over the preceding year which had 560 deaths from this "white plague."

For each death there are 5 suspects or contacts, it is estimated, and these are the people who are invited to the clinic of next week.

A goiter survey is being made this week in Jackson County by Dr. Robert Olesen who was ap-

of the United States Public Health Service to do this work. He is making a state wide tour examining high school and upper grade school. With the idea of learning the real extent of the goiter problem and then having a more concerted action taken by all citizens to prevent this sickness. Last year Dr. Geary of the County Health Unit with the help of Dr. Adams made a preliminary survey and found some school districts with every child showing a pronounced goiter tendency with the result that the school boards or the unit gave free preventative medicine.

### M'NABB ARRESTS TWO ON BURGLARY CHARGE

Local Men Are Held for Breaking Into Warehouse

After weeks of work, Chief of Police McNabb, Monday placed under arrest George Bowman and at his request Medford officers arrested Ray Cosart and obtained a complete confession from both on the charge of robbing the Swift Packing Company of this city, on the night of January 15.

According to the confession, on that night the two men broke into the warehouse of the company, and secured some meat, cheese, bacon, boiled ham, a tow chain and three tires, as well as an extra tire and rope from the car of M. S. Conner, which was in storage there. The men further admitted that they took the stolen articles to Gold Hill where they hid them in a woodshed for about a week. Then they were picked up and brought back to Ashland where, Cosart took them to Yreka and traded with a bootlegger there, for three gallons of moonshine.

The men were charged with burglary, and Bowman was released on bonds of \$1000. Cosart is being held in the county jail.

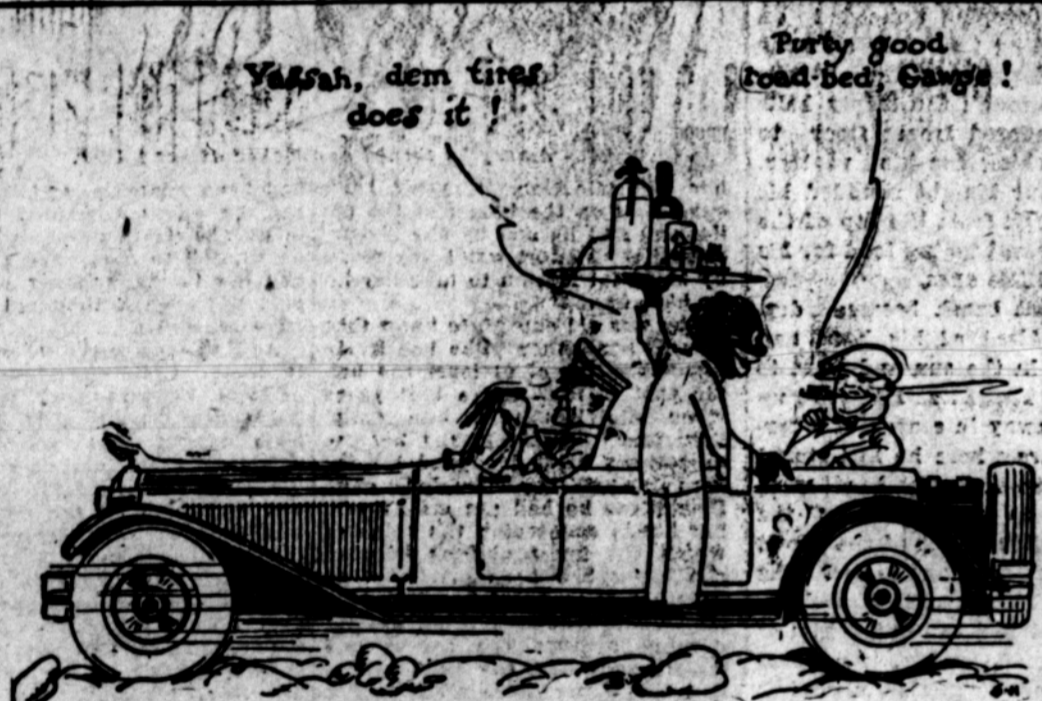
