

TORNADO WIPES OUT TEXAS TOWN



Sixty-one people were killed and 150 injured when a tornado practically wiped out the little town of Rock Springs, Tex. These pictures were obtained by an NEA cameraman, who went to the scene of the disaster in an airplane. As this picture shows, wreckage was strewn all over the landscape. Before the storm an automobile agency stood on this spot. The building was demolished and several motor cars were wrecked as completely as if they had been hit by a train. The trees also give mute evidence of the twister's fury.
