The defense raised a storm of objections to the application basing their stand on the fact that other names were on the blank. This was overruled. Other witnesses called during the afternoon by the state were Raules Moore, Medford attorney for fourteen years, and states attorney at the time the crime was committed. He identified many of the articles being used as evidence. Following him, Fred M. A cap was then produced which had figured earlier in the case and the witness thought it was the same one. This cap was positively identified by J. C. Beagle as being the same that was handed to him in the temporary sheriff's office at Ashland shortly after the day of the holdup, and declared further that he had seen the cap at the Siskiyou station prior to his visit to the sheriff's office. Coroner Testifies John E. Perl of Medford and county coroner told of the inquest held in the city hall at Ashland over the body of Oran Johnson, and identified many articles introduced as evidence, as being the same that were presented at the inquest. Former Sheriff C. E. Terrell, proved to be a connecting link in the handing down of evidence, his testimony having to do largely with the custody of Mazola cans, a grip, cap, gun, and the variety of other articles that are playing their small part in this modern drama.
