**JAPS WIN DECISION**  
SAN FRANCISCO, May 21. (AP)—The state supreme court today ruled that land owned by Orientals for the development of trade, aside from the agricultural industry, does not come under provisions of the California anti-alien land laws. The court on this interpretation of the law issued a writ of mandate ordering Secretary of State Frank Jordan to file articles of incorporation to the Japanese Hospital corporation of Los Angeles.
