NEW ORLEANS, La., (UP) The body of Earl Kilpatrick, assistant director of disaster relief work for the Red Cross who was killed in an airplane crash late yesterday, will be shipped to Port land, Oregon, for burial.

Kilpatrick was former dean of the extension school at the University of Oregon was graduated from that university. He was also superintendent of the Salem schools for three years. 
