POLO GROUNDS, New York, June 4.—(AP)—Joe Dundee of Baltimore, slashed and pounded his way to the welterweight championship of the world Friday night, outpointing Pete Latzo of Scranton in a 15-round bout before 25,000 spectators at the Polo Grounds. The championship changed hands on a judges' decisions without protest from even the most enthusiastic supporters of the Scranton welterweight, for Dundee had given Latzo a severe lacing before the bout was over. The new champion had the better of the milling in nine of the 15 rounds, while Latzo won the edge in but four sessions.
