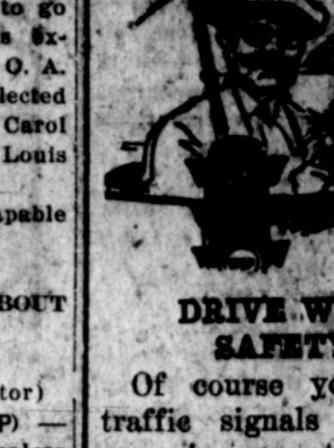
NEW YORK, June 6 (AP) - Due to the vogue for light colors for Summer wear and to the excessive cleaning bills required for silk frocks, washable linens have again assumed importance in the fashion world. Linens are important this year both abroad and in America as the smartest costumers are utilizing this long neglected material in their Summer collections.

Both plain and printed linens are being used for frocks and costumes of sports genre. The prints are usually of modernistic pattern, many of which are hand-blocked. Printed linen coats of short jacket length, three-quarters or full length, are worn over frocks of matching material or over plain linen which harmonizes with the main color of the print. Printed coats worn with plain colored frocks are usually trimmed with the plain material in some manner.

For tennis and golf purposes white linen sleeveless frocks with short printed jackets are sported.
