OCEAN FLYING TO BE COMMON

SAN FRANCISCO, June 7 (AP)—Trans-ocean flying will be a common mode of transportation within a decade, in the opinion of Mrs. Almee Beachey, 78, mother of the late Lincoln Beachey, America's first aerial stunt hero and pioneer flyer.

"These men who have crossed the Atlantic—Lindbergh, Chamberlin and Levine—have done something which will bring development of aviation along at a pace never before believed possible," Mrs. Beachey said in an exclusive interview with the United Press at her home here.

Mrs. Beachey has been enthusiastic follower of all progress in the air since her son thrilled the world with his daredevil stunts in the air. It was Beachey who, during the world fair here in 1915, performed the first loop-the-loop in aviation history.
