"I Did The Best Job I Knew How" Says Murderer In Confession
LAMAR, Okla., June 9.—(AP)—After pondering for four days over the question of whether Charles Albers, 52, a blacksmith, was "of any good to him," Raymond Bock, a farmer, used a hammer, a knife and an automobile to kill him. Bock calmly admitted to authorities today.
"I was commanded by himself on June 3 to kill Albers," Bock told police today. "I thought about it for four days. Yesterday I did it."
"I did the best job I knew how," he told the police in finishing his confession.
