Bride's Cake The white bride's cake to cut at the table, contains the fa vors and is made as follows:

1 cup shortening 2 cups sugar 1 teaspoon almond or vanill extract

Whites of six eggs 3-4 cups milk 3 1-2 cups flour 3 teaspoons cream of tartar

baking powder Beat shortening Add alternately, a little at a time, til very light and add to batter, folding in very lightly willout beating. Bake in a round greased East Side Pharmacy. loaf pan in a moderate oven at 325 degrees F. about one hour. Cover the cake with ornamental frosting. The decorations may be the tiny candy ornament found in confectioners' shops or rose leaves and other designs worked out with ornamental frosting made as follows:

1 1-2 cups granulated sugar 1-2 cup water 2 egg whites 1 teaspoon flavoring extract

1 teaspoon cream of tartar

baking powder. Boil sugar and water without stirring until syrup spins a thread


