session of school is open not only to the people at Ashland, but to any children who care to come from whatever district. "No promise can be made as to the account of work that will be covered. Whether the child deserves to be advanced or not is left entirely with the teachers in charge. The thing that is sure to be accomplished is the strengthening of pupils all along the line. All pupils who are weak in one or more subjects should attend the school. Those who have been ill and missed a part of the work, those who are hoping to advance a grade should get this extra work. "Six weeks is one-sixth of the school year and since education is a growth, no boy or girl, who is not profitably employed, can not afford to miss the opportunity of attending school. "The books used will be the regular state texts. There will be no expense to any parents other than that of any regular school term. It should also be noted that this school is conducted by the State and at State expense, so whatever good may come from it is reaped by the

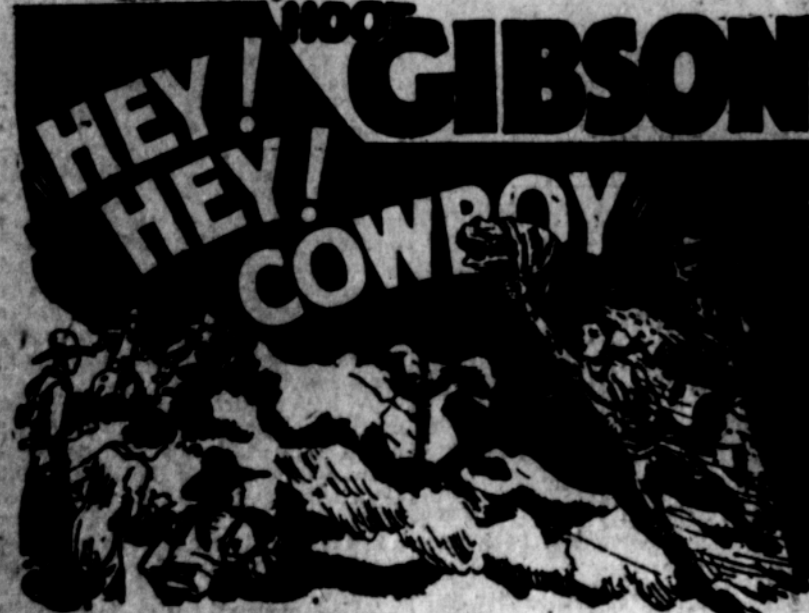
