Coddling Moth Spray Time Here however.

Orchardists are advised by County Agent Inskeep of Clackamas, to apply the first codling moth cover spray as soon as possible now, as the adult moths have been flying about for several days. Powdered lead arsenate is the standard control material. The usual dilution is two pounds to 100 gallons of spray solution. In hose regions where wormy apples are particularly difficult to prevent, the lead arsenate should be increased to three or four pounds to the 100 gallons.
