RULES AND REGULATIONS

Ashland Golf Course

- 1—The rules of the United States Golf Association will govern all competition and all players are requested to familiarize themselves with such rules.
- 2—High-heeled shoes will not be allowed on the course.
- 3—No players shall play until the parties in front are out of range, nor play up to any putting green until the players in front have holed out and moved away.
- 4—Driving a ball from any putting green is prohibited. Hole flags must not be stuck into turf or putting greens. They should either be held in hand or carefully laid down while putting but and afterwards placed in cup.
- 5—Golf bags or clubs must not be thrown or laid on the putting greens.
- 6—Turf cut or displaced by a stroke or otherwise, must be replaced at once and pressed down with foot.
- 7—The player whose ball is farthest from the flag must in all cases play first, while his opponents must remain back and out of range of the player's ball.

MAYOR WILL DRIVE BALLS OVER GREEN

Famous Architect Laid Out Ashland Greens—Tourists Will Be Welcomed—Splendid Irrigation System Is Installed—93 Acres Are Included.

When Mayor and Mrs. C. H. Pierce drive a golf ball—possibly far, far away over the distant horizon — Wednesday afternoon, the Ashland Golf Club course will be formally opened.

The Ashland stores will close at 4 p. m. that day in order that everybody may attend the official dedication of the magnificent new recreational center of the city. While the unofficial ceremonies will start immediately after the luncheon hour, the official opening will occur after 4 o'clock so that the merchants and employees may attend.

In accordance with one of the club's rules, the mayor and his wife will perform at the first tee. The mayor is reported to have issued a challenge to any member of the club to follow him with a longer drive than he or his wife make.

During the earlier part of the afternoon, there will be various contests, including events where prizes will be given by the golf club and by The Nininger Sporting Goods house for the longest drive, mashie, midiron or putter shots by amateurs and in other classifications.

EIGHT HOLES TO BE READY FOR OPENING

Ashland Stores To Close Wednesday Afternoon And Everybody Should Be At Grounds To See Mayor And Mrs. Pierce Make First Drives.

By working the splendid irrigation system at the Ashland Golf Club course for 24 hours daily, with three shifts of men handling the hose, the club has been enabled to make unusual progress in their effort to give Ashland a first class golf course this summer.

Wednesday, when the official opening will be held, eight holes will be ready for play. Six of these will be open holes, while two will be reserved — one for practice shots and the other for women who are prohibited from playing on the other greens because of high heels.

The greens, the officials report, are in splendid condition, while the fairways are good, but will be improved later by fertilization.

The irrigation system is said to be one of the best operated by any golf club. This cost approximately \$4,000, the water being procured from the Talent Irrigation ditch. 1800 feet of one-inch hose is used in sprinkling the greens and fairways. \$18,000 has been spent on the course and for the land.

The Ashland course was laid out by Sam Whiting, architect and

professional on the Olympic course in San Francisco and experts say that, when completed, it will compare favorably with the best that can be found in the smaller communities along the coast. While the entire acreage includes 93 acres, there are only 20 acres under irrigation, comprising the nine holes which the club will have completed this summer.

The golf course has been constructed not only for the use of Ashland members and friends, but will be open to tourists, many of whom carry their golf outfits with them and make frequent stops to enjoy a little recreation on the golf courses. Regular charges will be made for tourists.

Golf Club For All

Social and recreational activities of a community often tell the story of whether the community is a live one or whether it is self-satisfied.

Ashland is a live community, for social and recreational activities are given their proper part in the community life. The chamber of commerce has its social gatherings in its forums; The Lithians, the Civic Club and other organizations add to the charm of the city from a social and civic standpoint.

For recreation, Ashland furnishes the children's playgrounds, has its baseball team, and is ever ready to join in any worthy recreational activity.

Wednesday, The Ashland Golf Club will formally open its 9-hole course south of the city. This will eventually be one of the prettiest, as well as sportiest, courses on the coast and will add considerably to the recreational advantages which Ashland will have to offer to its citizens and its visitors. The advantages of a golf club are too well known to make discussion necessary.

This course is for everybody and Ashland should respond to the invitation of the club to visit its course. There will be no effort made to sell you anything Wednesday—just to merely acquaint you with this newest attraction Ashland has to offer.

NEW TERMS

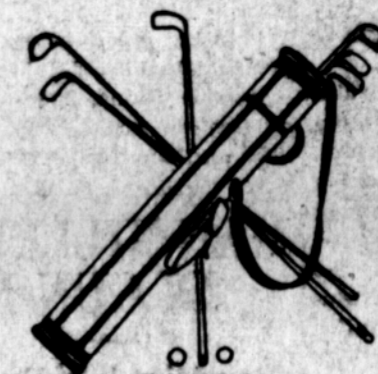
