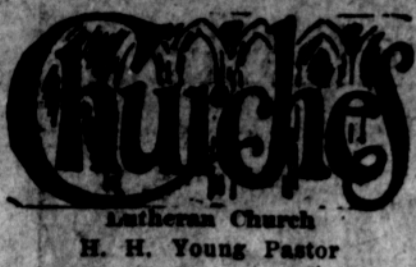


# NEWS of the MARKETS

### Spanish Cream that's a real treat!

Soak 1 1/2 cups, granulated gelatin in 1 1/2 cups water and 1/4 cup Alpine milk for 5 minutes. Soak 1 egg white with 1/4 cup sugar and pinch of salt. Add to gelatin mixture and cook until it becomes the consistency of custard. Fold in stiffly beaten whites of 2 eggs and add 1 tsp. vanilla. Put in mold which has been chilled with cold water. When set, serve with fruit.
