## GOOD FISHING, SWIMMING AT LAKE O' WOODS

### Water Reaches High Mark Outdoor Fireplaces Of Lot Owners Threatened— Road Has Been Improved Recently And Will Be Ready By Fourth.

Good fishing, boating, and swimming is to be found at the Lake O' the Woods this year, it is reported by a number of Ashland people who have been making week-end trips to the summer resort.

This year the lake is higher than it has been for several years, the water coming up so far that it has threatened to ruin the outdoor fireplaces built on the beach last year and the year before by lot-owners.

Due to this high water it is not necessary to build long piers for the boats or to go more than a few feet in order to swim.

The lake is stocked with various kinds of fish, including trout, salmon, and bass, every year, and fishermen report that the catches during the past few weeks have been large and numerous.

The road has been recently graded and prepared for the large amount of summer travel, and is in good condition. The recent storm, however, cut up the road to quite an extent and there are several bad mud holes, but the worst ones are avoided by detours, it is said.
