Fire Destroys Army Building

SAND ROCK, N. J., June 29.—(AP)—A human chain which Monday night prevented spread of a raging cantonment fire, saved from destruction one of the largest single munitions depots in the vicinity of New York.

Walls of fire destroyed six wartime cantonment buildings on the Fort Hancock reservation, men under Lieutenant G. C. Bunting used water and sand to keep the flames from reaching the three munitions buildings containing a huge quantity of 12, 14 and 16 inch high explosive shells.

Light violations are second on the list, with 34 motorists warned not to operate without tail lights burning, six with improper spotlights, 25 driving with only one headlight burning, 13 with illegally adjusted lights, while four motorists were warned not to continue to operate their cars without headlights.

SALEM, Ore., June 29.—(AP)—William A. Marshall, veteran member of the State Industrial accident commission, has resigned effective June 30 and on July 1 will open an office in Seattle to assume the duties of deputy commissioner to administer the new federal longshoremen's and harbor workers compensation act.

The new position is under civil service and carries with it a salary of \$5,200 per year.

FIVE GET SENTENCE IN PENITENTIARY

LOS ANGELES, June 29.—(AP)—Five persons were sentenced today to serve from one to 10 years

in San Quentin penitentiary as a result of the fatal shooting of "Two Gun" Tom Kerrick, movie cowboy.

The defendants were Mrs. Kerick, Iris Burns, Anita Davis, Joe Hunt and Henry Isbell.

The verdict, passed by Judge Hardy, was unique in that it is the only instance in California California jurisprudence where five persons have been found guilty of the same slaying.
