MISPLACED ORGANS

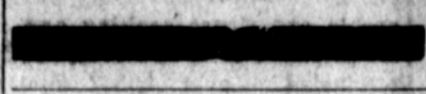

JURY FINDS DOT GUILTY

LOS ANGELES, June 30.—(AP)—Dorothy Mackaya, emotion stage actress, was found guilty late Wednesday of committing a felony by attempting to conceal the manner of the death of her husband, Ray Raymond, musical comedy star.

The verdict, returned in less than three hours by a jury of eight women and four men, decided the felony was manslaughter. She may be sentenced to either one to three years in the penitentiary or six months in the county jail.
