Home Hints

Save on Pancake Batter—Instead of throwing away the few spoonfuls of pancake batter left from breakfast, it may be used for chops, veal, steak or any other meat which would otherwise be dipped in egg and crumbs.

A Use for Rhubarb—Gather large quantities of it, stew, and drain as for jelly, add any other fruit juices preferred, mix with about half as much sugar as liquid, boil a few minutes and can. The addition of orange and lemon juice, or pineapple and lemon, makes a delicious drink for hot weather with water to suit the taste.

To Render Uncooked Vegetables Crisp—Put into cold water with a bit of ice and a tablespoon of lemon juice or vinegar. Let stand half an hour or so and when ready to use dry between folds of cheesecloth.

After Grating Cheese that is quite fresh, rub a hard crust of bread over the grater. The grater is freed of the particles of cheese and the crumbs of bread and cheese are always useful.

A New Flavor for Beefsteak—Beefsteak may be cooked with sliced green peppers instead of onions or mushrooms for a change. The piquant flavor of green peppers seems to transform an ordinary steak into an entirely different dish.

A Delicious Sauce—Is made by cooking gooseberries and strawberries together.

MOSCOW, July 1.—(AP)—A homeless youngster, fallen among thieves, endured beatings and threats until he could stand no more, then turned up a gang of 12 men and women bandits to the police and led four of his oppressors to a wall before a firing squad. The leader of the gang committed suicide when the child led police to his hiding place.

Home Hints

Give the Stove a Vacation
Each summer the typewriter and the office desk get a good two weeks vacation but the poor cook stove works all summer long. Why not give it a vacation, too?

The great emancipator for the cook stove is the summer fruit salad for which none of the ingredients need be cooked beforehand. With slight variations it can be used at any course in the meal. Served with a simple French dressing, it answers the demand for a tart, light, refreshing accompaniment to the heavy main course. With cheese, nuts and a mayonnaise or hulled dressing made with eggs, it furnishes protein value for a main dish. A whipped cream salad dressing or sweetened cream mayonnaise and dainty garnishes such as cherries, strawberries, dates, nuts or sprigs of fresh mint answer the American demand for an attractive sweet dessert that is not too rich for the light summer meal.

To offer contrast in color, flavor and texture of the different foods nothing can be more satisfactory than the tart, pale, juicy grapefruit or oranges used with a bland, rich, dark fruit as dates. The grapefruit can now be purchased canned and separated in firm, whole sections all ready for serving. As any other dressing except the simple French dressing draws out the juice of cut fruits and makes a watery salad if mixed with these ingredients, it is usually better to dress the salad just before serving on individual plates or at the table.


UPSET DAY

WIMBLEDON, Eng., July 1.—(AP)—"Upset day" at Wimbledon turned tennis predictions topsy turvy Thursday.

Foremost in the disorderly scheme of things was the astonishing defeat of "Big Bill" Tilden by Henri Cochet, young and glittering Frenchman. The American star had everything his own way for two sets and was leading, 5-1, in the third when the terrific heat began to tell on Tilden and Cochet became the victor, 3-6, 4-5, 7-5, 6-4, 6-3.

The other semi-final match in men's singles also had an unexpected outcome. Rene La Soste, the French star who has been racing through the tournament, fell before Jean Borotra, compatriot and defending champion, 6-4, 6-3, 1-6, 1-6, 6-2.

Then there was that match between Elizabeth Ryan and Benoit De Alvarez of Spain. The Californian had beaten Mrs. Kitty McKane Godfree and looked like a certain finalist, but the Spanish girl had youth on her side and she won, 3-6, 6-0, 6-4.

SUNSHINE PRESERVES

With the supply of early summer fruit we are all anxious to make preserves, jams and jellies with the least possible work, and yet make them in a way to retain the natural color and flavor of the fruit.

In order to do both of these you must not cook too large a quantity at a time or allow them to cook too long. It's the long period of cooking that makes preserves of a strong flavor and dark in color.

By the method of sun cooking the heat is not so intense and the flavor much improved. The equipment required is a

large preserving kettle, spoon, deep platters or shallow soap dishes, and window glass to cover them. The glass prevents any dust or dirt from entering.

Take the same weight of sugar as fruit, bring slowly to the boiling point and boil six minutes without stirring in order to keep the fruit whole. Pour in the plates and allow to stand in the hot sun two or three days until the syrup is very thick. Place either in sterilized jars of glass and seal.

Any fruit may be preserved in this way, just remember to cook it in small quantities and boil rapidly to preserve the color, shape and flavor of the fruit.
