Spaniard Drops Negro in International Bout Wednesday
EBBETS FIELD, Brooklyn, N. Y., July 14. — (UP) — Paulino Uzcudum of Spain wrapped his mighty right hand around his heels in the fourth round Wednesday night and sent it swishing through the air flush against the unprotected, unsuspecting jaw of old Harry Wills of Harlem.
 The surprised negro went down with a crash, and the international heavyweight bout which drew a goodly crowd to Ebbets field this sultry night came to an end. Wills watched with a dazed look while the counter tolled off the seconds and struggled to an upright position at the count of nine, but Paulino, no longer the bashful Basque of the early rounds, was upon him like a tiger.
 A right hand to the jaw sent the big black sagging against the ropes and a left hook finished him. Wills took the count in a sitting position, bewildered and unable to get on his feet.

BOY DIES IN WOODEN PIPE

Body Carried Through 12 Inch Pipe, Caught in Small Section
YAKIMA, Wash., July 14. — (UP) — Caught in the swirling waters of a penstock and carried a quarter of a mile, the body of Woodrow Johnson, 6, was found wedged in a six inch wooden pipe.
 The discovery was made following a frantic search by the boy's father, Dr. David Johnson, and neighbors.
 Drawn from a water box into a 12 inch pipe, the boy was driven through that into an 8 inch pipe on to a point of water diversion where the body was driven into a 6 inch pipe and could not be removed until a portion of the pipe was cut away.

Will Rogers Gets Company In Unexpected "Non-Stop" Offer

BEVERLY HILLS, Cal., July 14. — (UP) — Mr. and Mrs. John Collins of Oklahoma roared in their nonstop flier into Will Rogers' backyard at 4 a. m. Wednesday and announced: "We are here."
 The ropethrowing mayor of Beverly Hills, unwitting sponsor of the Claremore, Oklahoma-Beverly Hills nonstop jaunt, was somewhat abashed by the unexpected arrival.
 Nevertheless, he sent cheers to the couple from his bed while Mrs. Rogers waved a flag from a second story window, in true Rogers family fashion.
 "I'm usually paid for being funny," was the message sent by Rogers from his bed. "Does this cost me \$500?"
 Collins averred that it would and referred Rogers to the announcement that the comedian made recently through a newspaper syndicate that he would pay that sum to the first persons to make the nonstop flier trip from Claremore, the comedian's home town.
 A short time later another flier containing Robert Kloeher and Ross Hutchins also of Claremore roared into the front yard and, seeing an argument in prospect and having failed to appoint properly constituted judges, Rogers referred the contestants to the chief of police of Beverly Hills.
 Kloeher and Hutchins said they left Claremore at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, amid the cheers of Chamber of Commerce officers and had no notice that Collins was on the road.
 Both machines were constructed with numerous extra gas tanks that fed the gasoline automatically.
 Hutchins said the trip of 1840 miles was made on 90 gallons of gasoline.
