GIANTS WANT JEWISH STAR

Jack LeRoy Worth His Weight in Gold, Johnny McGraw Believes

NEW YORK, Aug. 5.—(P)—"If I could find a real Jewish star for my ball club I wouldn't trade him for Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig combined." John J. McGraw, manager of the New York Giants, has been heard to exclaim more than once since little Andy Cohen failed to fill the role and was cut out of the minors.

McGraw figures that an enthusiastic ball player of pronounced Semetic extraction would be the greatest possible drawing card in New York City.

The Giant's manager proved he meant what he said when he gave up \$10,000 the other day for Jack Le Roy, a Jewish pitcher with the Charlotte, N. C., club who just at present is leading the hurlers in the "Sally" League.

Le Roy, or Levy, to give him his real name and the one he will be required to wear while a member of the Giants, is not only a good pitcher, but an outfielder who can stick 300 or so in fairly fast company. As McGraw never knows when he is going to need an outfielder or two, it will be a comfort to him to have an extra one in the bull pen.

Le Roy, or Levy, is said to be something of a champion on the fiddle as well. The Giants have not had a musician along since Jack Bentley and his ukelele were dispatched, back, back, back to Baltimore.

McGraw figures that if Levy can pitch like Christy Mathewson he will become a great favorite with the N. Y. fans who just now are showing more interest in the doings of the Yankees than in the less spectacular activities of the Giants.

The newly acquired Jewish pitcher will not report until the "Sally" League season closes. McGraw will groom him for the popularity contest next spring.

Principals of Bolshevism Grow Weak in Red Russia—Utopia Communism and socialism, even in Soviet Russia, have been relegated to some future Utopia, according to Dr. Alexander Kaun, authority on Russian politics and a member of the summer sessions faculty at the University of California at Los Angeles. As a principal, bolshevism is much weaker in Russia now than it was 10 years ago because it has been forced to undergo a process of continual compromise with reality. "The real test of bolshevism," Dr. Kaun said, "came in 1920 when Russia had expelled her invaders on every side. The Russian peasant proved all too human. "No longer faced by the danger of foreign invasion, the Russian peasant turned capitalist. He refused to sacrifice the fruits of his labor and reduced production. As a consequence, industry became demoralized. "Lenin saw the danger and beat a hasty retreat. The peasant was permitted to sell the surplus of his products and communism was automatically negated." Difference between the Russian despot of 1914 and the despot of today, according to Dr. Kaun, is merely one of relationship.
