### COVER CROP TO BE MADE THIS MONTH

County Agent L. E. Jones issues the following advice in regard to cover crops: "In orchards where the soil cements together, because of dry and is difficult to work, a program increasing the organic content of the soil, should be followed. This increasing of humus improves the physical character of the soil, resulting in many advantages, such as ease of working, ease of irrigation, and better retention of moisture. "The cheapest method, in most cases, in obtaining bulky organic matter, is by growing annual cover crops. Vetches, particularly Hungarian are well adapted to this section, and may be grown separately or in combination with some grain crop such as rye or oats. "Seeding of this important crop should be done at once, so that germination and growth may be started before temperatures become too low. The rate of seeding should be from 40 to 50 pounds of vetch and an equal amount of the grain. "If vetch has been grown successfully on the soil no inoculation of seed is necessary but if difficulty has been experienced in obtaining a stand in past years, the vetch seed should be inoculated before planting. Inoculation cultures with directions can be obtained directly from the Bacteriology Dept. Oregon Agriculture College, Corvallis, Oregon."

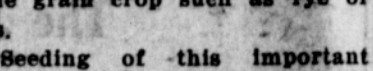
