SCORE KILLED AS CYCLONE STRIKES CITY

Storm Rages Over St. Louis for Five Minutes—Sweeps Across Mississippi and Other Mid-Western States Suffer—Wreckage Expected to Reveal Victims.

At 2:30 o'clock reports were that a score had been killed and 400 injured. Sixteen bodies were in the city morgue at that hour, and several others were known to be dead. It is believed a search of the wreckage will reveal more victims. The storm raged for five minutes.

GRANITE CITY, Ill., Sept. 29

The cyclone leaped across the Mississippi river from St. Louis, tore through Venice and Madison Industrial district. Three Illinois terminal company employes were reported killed and many others injured. Many were arriving at the hospital this afternoon.
