He awoke with a headache which he didn't have when he entered the alley, and minus \$3,000 in precious stones which he did have when he started to collect his debt from sister Angelina.

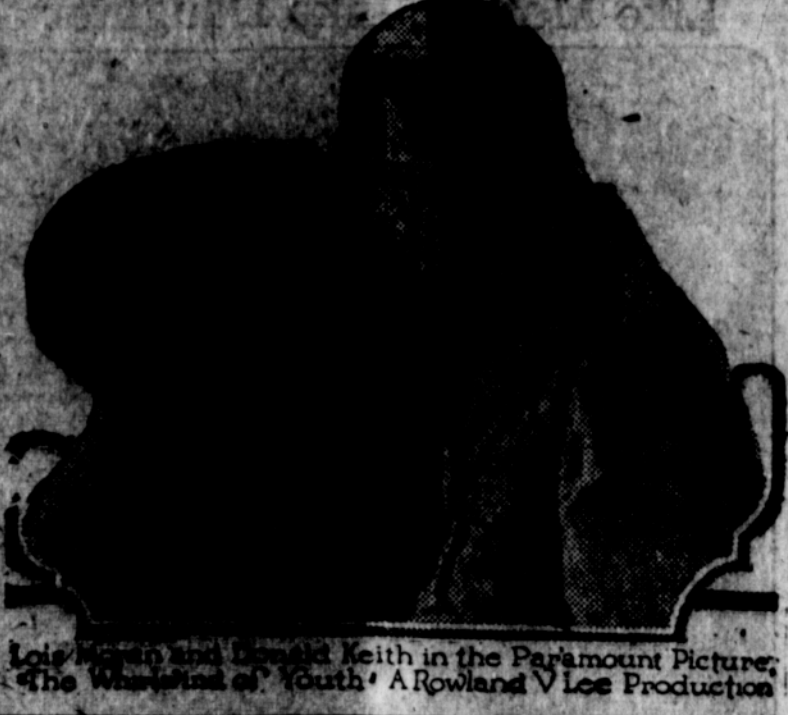

"As it is, all their up-bringing educates them to be disrespectful. Fathers and mothers speak disrespectfully of others and talk only about their own rights — never of other's rights. They go about with a chip on their shoulders, ready to break out at the least provocation. So their children grow up with similar chips on their shoulders.

"Unless the minds of the parents can be turned, it is hopeless to try to change the minds of the children.

To lie, to steal and destroy, to play before other people's houses instead of their own they consider their right.

"The children who are at the top are insufferable and idiotic snobs. They learned it from their parents. It all comes to this—parents of all classes need to be shown the great necessity for teaching the children truthfulness, honesty, respect for all people and respect for everyone's rights. To make the teaching of any effect they will have to practice what they teach.
