NEUNER WILL LEAD DEFENSE

Talent Case Transfer Will Be Heard in Court Monday

U. S. District Attorney George A. Neuner will represent Terry A. Talent, federal prohibition agent in the local district court Monday making a request for the transfer of the Talent trial, in connection with an involuntary manslaughter indictment, to the federal court at Portland.

If the state prosecutor, L. J. Lillequist, who represented in the state in the grand jury investigation and who will prosecute the case, has any objection to the transfer he will argue the case before Judge Orlando Corliss as will Attorney Neuner.

Federal Judge Bean yesterday issued a writ of habeas corpus cum causa in the Jackson county court requesting the transfer of the case to the federal court.

REV. NELSON GIVES PLANS

Not to Condemn nor Defend but Present Facts for Purpose

Not to condemn nor condemn, but to present facts and let each individual draw his own conclusions as to right and wrong" according to Rev. H. W. Nelson, is the motive which will inspire his sermon to be delivered Sunday morning at the Phoenix Presbyterian church.

Rev. Nelson will speak on "Law Enforcement" and will deal particularly with the recent criticism leveled at a federal officer because of the fatal wounding of a bootlegger, who after attempting to wrest the gun from the officer, fled and was accidentally wounded and later died.

Rev. Nelson has spent two weeks in interviewing law enforcement officers of the county and all others who would in any way be familiar with the facts of the case and says he believes, with statements and affidavits he has credited information in which should be presented to the public. He spoke Thursday evening at a mass meeting held in Medford.
