

# DEATH TOLL IS OVER 300

### Tragedy in Shark-Infested Waters Shows Appalling Death List

RIO DE JANEIRO, Oct. 25.—(AP)—The number of persons unaccounted for in the sinking of the ocean liner *Princesa Mafalda* shot up to 319 today on the basis of figures compiled after a check of survivors aboard all known rescue ships.

Until all rescue vessels reach port the exact number of victims of this major disaster will not be known. Of the 1286 passengers and crew on the *Mafalda*, 939 have apparently been accounted for—leaving 317 still missing. The figures, as compiled by the United Press from every available source:

Landed by *Mosella*—22.  
Aboard Dutch steamer *Alhena*—530.

Aboard *Formosa*—353.  
Received aboard steamer *Rosetti*—27.

Died aboard *Mosella*—4.  
Seen to be eaten by shark—1.  
There was some doubt that the *Rosetti* carried survivors.

How frantic humans were swallowed by mountainous, shark-infested seas was described today by survivors of the Italian liner *Princesa Mafalda*, arriving here aboard the French steamer *Mosella*.

"I saw a shark swallow a man," said a passenger of the *Mosella*, which rescued 80 persons and brought 24 to Bahia. The others having been transferred to the French steamer, *Formosa*.

"We picked up many bodies and threw them into the raging sea again to make room for the survivors," said the purser of the *Mosella*. "We saw many mangled bodies floating on the water."

"It was terrible. Horrible—it shall always remain a gruesome memory," said Commander Privat of the rescue ship, a mariner hardened by the way of the sea.

"I saw the captain on the bridge when the boat went down. Perhaps he is still on the bridge," said First Engineer Carlo Laise-to of the *Mafalda*.

STOCKHOLM—(AP)—The standard of the Swedish home has been raised by compulsory courses in cooking and home management, sewing and the care of babies which have been a feature of the Stockholm Public Schools for more than 40 years, according to Miss Gertrude Bergstrom, City Inspector of the Stockholm School Kitchens.

Before her marriage to the Belgian Crown Prince, the Swedish Princess, Astrid graduated with honors after taking a similar course.
