ments receiving compensation for services rendered other departments.

Argument centered around the legality of making this special sinking fund appropriation which would mean an increase of approximately two mills on a tax levy, and the pro- election pamphlet promises that the money should be raised from the water funds.

According to approximated figures, if the interest on the bonds must be raised from the water rates, it will mean a neat 60 per cent increase to raise the needed approximate \$20,000, additional for bond retirement and interest.

The final decision was reached after lengthy discussion which ended shortly before midnight.

A second adjustment of water rates must be made if the project is carried through, according to the decision of the budget committee.

The approximate cost of this work will be \$650, according to the city engineer. It was stated the macadam would be rapidly worn away unless some sort of protection were given.

Human bones, enough to account for four men were found. Only two men were aboard when the ship was picked up Monday. The other ten and woman are believed to have been sacrificed one at a time as food ran out, and the bones thrown overboard at first, but later left lay on the ship as the men grew weaker. A severe struggle must have preceded the death of one victim as a bloody knife and shattered jaw bone were found.

\$25,030, 1928 budget, and increase of \$6,035, and General Bond Sinking Department, \$11,500, 1927 budget and \$15,500, 1928 budget, an increase of \$4,000. These two items are fixed, and the increase is not included in the general six per cent limitation.

City councilmen in making final passage on the budget are permitted a 10 per cent leeway, in either direction on estimates made with the citizens committee, according to City Attorney Wm. Briggs.

Farm Hints

Some tomatoes may be saved even after frost by following the practice of European truck gardeners, suggests the experiment station. They pick tomatoes green with the stem attached and hang them to the rafters of a room which is kept between 43 and 48 degrees. The tomatoes will ripen slowly under these conditions, and faster if the temperature is kept between 75 and 80 degrees.

Experienced Oregon capon raisers feed their birds regular rations until two weeks before marketing. Then they feed them a wet mash composed of 61 parts ground yellow corn and 41 parts ground oats with the hulls sifted out, or 41 parts wheat middlings, mixed with sufficient buttermilk to make it pour easily, says the experiment station. This is fed in troughs, preferably at noon, in a quantity which the capons can clean up in 20 or 30 minutes.

Growers in Oregon who plan to plant strawberries the coming season are warned against purchasing plants infected with the strawberry root weevil, says the department of entomology at the experiment station. Land already infected with the weevil is planted to grain the first year following berries. Clover for one year, a cultivated crop one year, and then strawberries again for three years, makes a good rotation. New plantings are set with weevil-free plants and on weevil-free ground.

Home Hints

Use sour cream as the liquid in making veal or lamb gravy.
Put a bay leaf in the pan with roast pork or braised pork chops.
Ham baked in pineapple juice is delicious.
The syrup left from pickled fruits such as peaches or pears makes a delicious flavoring for roasts meats.
Try pouring a cup of such juices and a cup of water over a roast of veal or beef.
Serve fried oysters with beef pot roast and use the oyster liquor for making the gravy.
Lamb or mutton may be roasted on a bed of tart apples.
The flavor of veal is developed by slow and thorough cooking and the addition of fat.
Creamed ham should be highly seasoned. A teaspoon of Worcestershire Sauce to one cup of White Sauce gives an added zest.
Cheese melted in the sauce of creamed chipped beef is a good addition.
An equal amount of cooked beets and boiled potatoes makes a corned beef hash that is different.
A thick slice of veal baked in milk is very good.
