WASHINGTON, Nov. 3 .-(LP) The government today obtained evidence in the Fall-Sinciair jury tampering investigation purporting to connect Mason Day, vicepresident of the Sinclair exploration company directly with Harry F. Sinclair in Sinclair's personal activities during the trial which was declared a mistrial.

This evidence identified Day as the employer of the personal chauffeur for Sinclair during the trial. Day had already been named by the government as a contact man between the Burns detective shadowing the jurors and real employer of sleuths alleged to have been employed by Sinclair.


