Some Splendid Apple Recipes

Apple Loaf Take enough bread dough to make a small loaf. Work into this a tablespoon of butter and one-third cup of sugar. One-half teaspoon of cinnamon and one egg which has been well beaten. Add a little flour, knead and let rise. Divide this into three parts; roll each to lit the pan. Put one layer into buttered pan, spread over with a layer of finely chopped apples easily cooked up. Pour over this melted butter and a little cinnamon. Lay second piece of dough on the top and proceed as above. When it is very light brush it over with milk and steam an hour and then brown lightly in oven. Serie in slices with pudding sauce.

Slice apples and dip into batter made of two tablespoons sour milk, two tablespoon sugar and one-half egg yolk and pinch of sods. Add flour to make a batter & triffe stiffer than pan-cake batter. Bake in hot deep fat.
