

Doughnuts Are Ideal Sweets For Cold, Winter Weather

It has been the general opinion of most people that doughnuts are indigestible and should be excluded from the diet. The truth of the matter is this—foods cooked or fried in deep hot fat are not so difficult to digest as those cooked in a small amount because the hot fat sears the outside, making a hard crust and prevents any of the fat soaking into the food that is being cooked.

Any food cooked in deep fat has a distinctive and delicious flavor. All the juices and flavor has been retained because of the quick searing imparting this good flavor, and when properly fried the outside is crisp and always pleasing to the taste.

Foods cooked in deep fat must be properly fried in order to make them easily digested; if fried too quickly, they are under-cooked and if fried too slowly they absorb too much of the fat.

The success of doughnuts depends a lot upon the kind of fat used. Lard, commercial fats and oils are all good because they have a high smoking temperature. Butter, bacon fryings or chicken fat smoke easily and are not desirable for deep fat frying.

There must be sufficient fat in the kettle being used to thoroughly cover the food and be of the proper temperature. If too small an amount of fat is used, when the cold doughnuts are added, it cools quickly and they soak the fat rather than form the crust on the outside immediately.

Often when frying in deep fat people make the mistake of thinking that the fat is at the proper temperature when it smokes. This is not true. When it smokes it is too hot, the fat being decomposed and forms a substance which is difficult to digest. A more satisfactory way to test the fat is to place a cube of bread in it and if it browns in 60 seconds, it is of the proper temperature.

To prevent doughnuts from containing an excess of fat, have the fat of the proper temperature. The egg in the dough

congelates and forms a crust on the outside, preventing the fat from soaking into the doughnut.

When doughnuts crack on the surface, it indicates that they have not been properly fried. The cracking is caused by having too rich a mixture or by too low a temperature of the fat, therefore, to be successful in your doughnuts making watch the temperature of the fat and be careful as to the mixture used.

92 EMPLOYEES FACE CHARGES

Unusual Case Develops Out of Alleged Violation Injunction

CINCINNATI, O., Dec. 1.—(AP)—Twenty-two of 92 present and former employees of the National Cash Register Company of Dayton, Ohio, will go on trial on contempt charges early this morning before the court of Federal Judge Smith Hickenlooper. The other seventy persons against whom the charges were placed have been dismissed.

The trial grew out of charges made by the Remington Cash Register Company that the men named had violated a perpetual injunction issued by the late Howard D. Hollister, U. S. District Judge, following a hearing on charges of restraint of trade against the Dayton company. The injunction was issued in 1914 and provided that all employees of the Dayton company refrain from interfering with the sale of any other make of cash register.

Honey Rich In Mineral Foods

Honey in addition to having more sweetening power than granulated sugar contains the much needed minerals that are removed entirely when sugar is refined, says H. A. Scullen, Oregon State bee specialist. Corn syrup or molasses are inferior to honey. The former is lacking both in sweetening power and minerals, and the latter contains an excess of lime. Honey is the only commercial sweet now known to contain vitamins.
