FACTORS IN QUALITY MILK

"The Factors," he continued, "which determine the quality of commercial milk are:

FOOD VALUE, FLAVOR AND ODOOR, KEEPING QUALITY, CLEANLINESS AND HEALTHFULNESS."

With the exception of the first, all are dependent upon the number and kinds of bacteria in the milk.

Experiments have shown that four principal factors, are necessary to produce a market milk with low bacterial content—clean cows, sterilized utensils, small top milk pail, and cooling immediately and holding the milk below 50 degrees.
