

FRIDAY'S NEWS

The coroner's inquest on this shooting of Lloyd Cordova, which occurred near Hills last Sunday, took place in the city hall this forenoon. The inquest was first set for yesterday morning at 10:30, then postponed to 5 o'clock in the afternoon on account of Prosecuting Attorney Roberts being too busy to set over. He was unable to come at that hour, however, so it was postponed again until this morning. As the prosecuting attorney could not get here then, Coroner Peil held the evidence himself.

The jury found on hearing the evidence that Lloyd Cordova came to his death by the accidental discharge of a gun in the hands of Frank C. O'Kelley. Mr. O'Kelley was present and told a straightforward story. According to the evidence Mr. O'Kelley had gone to the Cordova ranch Sunday and had taken along his gun. This he had leaned against a tree, when he saw some young boys playing near it. Thinking it unsafe for a loaded gun to be in the proximity of young boys, he started to withdraw the shells, when in some manner the gun was accidentally discharged, a bullet striking the Cordova boy, causing death.

Those serving on the jury were A. McMillin, E. E. Miller, Webster Wertz, E. P. Smith, E. J. Farlow and W. M. Barber.

Sheriff Terrill received word Saturday from Los Angeles that Goldie Attott and H. A. Corey of Medford had been arrested in the California city for alleged violation of the Mann act. The arrest was made by federal authorities. It is claimed, on complaint sworn to by the girl's father.

Both persons figuring in this case are well known in Medford. Corey is reported to be interested in a bakery there and is said to have a family. He is reported to have left Medford about six weeks ago, and is supposed to be in Spokane. The Abbott girl, who is about 26 years of age, was employed in the bakery as a waitress, and had left that city about three weeks ago. Relatives started a search for her, it is stated, which ended in her being located in Los Angeles.

The Ashland Canning company, owned and operated by M. C. and Bruce Linsinger, closed a most successful season during the past year, at which they had the largest pack the cannery has ever produced. The total value of their pack reached \$185,500. During the season they filled 7000 No. 2 cans; 78,999 No. 2 1/2 cans, and 51,000 No. 10 or gallon cans.

The number of pounds of the different kinds of fruits and vegetables used in the season's pack were: Apples, 4418; peaches, 14,418; cherries, 2150; plums, 15,572; pumpkin, 2500; tomatoes, 200, 231. All fruit and vegetables used in the cannery were practically home grown products, for which Messrs. Linsinger paid out \$3500. The labor which was also nearly all employed from Ashland they paid \$6500.
