ASHLAND TO HAVE BAND CONCERTS Ashland will have band concerts in the park this summer, starting at the convenience of the Rogue River Valley band as soon as the weather permits. This was confirmed at the meeting of the city council last night when the valley band sent a petition to council asking the city to subscribe the necessary fund for the purpose of supporting this organization. As the band is made up of players from various points in the county, arrangements are being formulated to have band concerts each week, alternately between Ashland and Medford, with each city subscribing to the

fund of maintaining the band. The Commercial Club is already pledged to pay into the band fund, and at the meeting of council last night it was agreed that the city will pay two-thirds of the expenses necessary in giving the concerts in Ashland, and the Commercial Club one-third. Medford will pay a like proportion, it is understood, and each city will have the benefit of semi-monthly concerts through the summer as long as the municipalities desire. The band will also be at quite an expense in keeping up the organization, and the city will assist in this fund.
