SUMMER SCHOOL CLOSES

WITH MUSICAL FEATURE
Last evening brought to a close the Summer School of Music which has been conducted in the Chau-tauqua Pioneer hall and in the large auditorium for the last six weeks, with Prof. Leland A. Coon of the University of Oregon faculty as director.

Although this project was started too late in the season to expect a large attendance this year, the interest and enthusiasm manifested by those who have availed themselves of the opportunities offered to broaden their musical abilities bespeak a very large measure of success for continuing the school on a more extensive scale for the coming year.

The final event, the rendition of "The Rose Maiden," by a chorus of Ashland singers, augmented by a considerable number from the Phoenix chorus, both of which have been working under the direction of Mr. Coon for the period of the "six weeks" school, was given last evening in the large auditorium. The audience was very appreciative and recognized with generous applause the merits of each individual performance.

The chorus work was excellent and showed the effect of the painstaking and careful work of the director, even in the short period covered.

The work of the soloists merits its special attention. Fletcher Fish, who sang the tenor role, is always heard with great pleasure by Ashland audiences and shows by the enthusiasm and heartiness with which he enters into a part the real artistic genius. Miss Hilty sang in a pleasing manner the contralto solo and the rich quality of tone was noticeable. Mrs. Elmore delighted the audience with the clear, beautiful tones for which her voice is recognized so well, and the generosity of this favorite Rogue River valley singer in responding to demands of this nature so freely merits the heartiest appreciation of all.

Mr. Coon again showed his versatility and thoroughness of training in essaying the baritone role and pleased the audience with his smooth, mellow tone. The duets, Mrs. Elmore with Mr. Fish and again with Mr. Coon, were especially enjoyable. The accompanists, Miss Bernice Yeo at the piano and Mrs. Van Posen at the organ, also came in for their share of appreciation from the audience for the splendid interpretation of the scores, and their sympathetic rendition.

CHILD WELFARE

WORK IN COUNTY
Forty-seven children in Jackson county were given a start along better, healthier manhood and womanhood in Jackson county in the four conferences held at Beagle, Belevue, West Central Point and Lake Creek early this month.

The Farm Bureau women in these communities met together at a previous meeting and discussed with Miss Lane, nutrition specialist of Oregon Agricultural College, and the home demonstration agent, how best they could help in the national movement for child welfare, realizing that the child welfare need is a problem which the women in the homes alone can answer by banding themselves together and going after it.

The most recent statistics show that in the United States there is at present a huge army of 5,000,000 children that are under-nourished and these mothers feel that in their communities they are going to answer the nourishment problem if possible. With this in mind a conference was held in each community. There were one or more doctors at each of these conferences to examine the children and a nurse to weigh and measure them. The object being to tell the mothers if there were other things to be corrected besides the feeding. Forty-seven children were weighed, measured and examined and the mother learned whether her child was up to par or not. Then each talked with Miss Lane and planned to overcome the deficiencies in weight if possible by seeing that the child has in the diet the food and the rest that is needed for a child to grow to normal weight, height and strength for his or her age. There are 28 of these 47 children who are below par and who are going to be brought up to standard if possible. The mothers of these children are home demonstrators who are going to apply some of the principles that Miss Lane and the home demonstration agent advocate in the feeding of children. And these children are going to be weighed and measured once a month and checked up. And those children that are in school the county nurse will give them exercises to help them develop.

These 28 home demonstrators are a wonderful beginning in a definite piece of child welfare work. And if the 28 children are made stronger, healthier citizens by the Farm Bureau women in these four communities taking a definite stand in answering the national crisis in child welfare, it is a piece of work the value of which cannot be estimated in dollars and cents.
