BY HORSE, DIES AT HILT The funeral of W. H. Smith, 356 Granite street, who died at Hilt, Calif., vesterday, was held from the Stock undertaking parlors of this city by the Roseburg lodge of Odd Fellows, of which Mr. Smith was a member. His death, at the age of 63, brings to light the strange story of a mining spector who has lived for years in Roseburg and in Ashland for the past three years without forming intimate friendships and about whole life comparatively little is known. The deceased was not known to have any living relatives.

Mr. Smith's death was the result of injuries received when he was thrown from his horse and dragged through the woods in Bumblebee Gulch the early part of this week. He was on the way to his mining claim in Bumblebee Gulch, when the accident occurred and it is thought that he lay helpless in the woods for about three days before discovered by two boys who were fishing in a nearby stream. He was found in a very weakened condition and although he was rushed to the hospital at Hilt he died shortly after his arrival there.
