Tidings of 1878 Is Given State Library By Judge Watson

TIDINGS SECOND OLDEST ESTAB-
LISHED NEWSPAPER IN
SOUTHERN OREGON

A copy of the Ashland Tidings of July 12, 1878, containing a story of the Port Orford massacre of 1830, written by J. Q. Latta, the son of one of the massacre victims, has been presented to the state library at Salem by Judge C. B. Watson, of Gold Hill, at one time connected with the Tidings. The incident calls to mind the Tidings' place in Oregon history, having been the second newspaper to become established in Southern Oregon.

Judge Watson also donated a copy of the State Line Herald, volume one, number one, published at Lakeview November 18, 1878, said to be the first newspaper published in Southern Oregon east of the Cascade mountains. Judge Watson was the former publisher on the Lakeview Herald.

R. RIVER VALLEY WILL HAVE LARGE CROP OF APPLES

Crop estimates just completed by the various shippers and the railroad company, indicate that the Rogue River valley will harvest a record-breaking apple crop this fall. Upwards of 1000 cars are predicted, which is 200 cars greater than any previous crop and three times the 1920 crop.

Latest figures indicate that the Bartlett tonnage will be from 70 to 75 per cent of the 1920 crops and the late varieties of pears will total about 70 per cent of last year's tonnage.

These figures, if born out by the harvest this fall, show the Rogue River valley is far in excess of most fruit producing sections of the country in its percentage of a normal crop. Late information from the federal bureau of markets shows 46 per cent of a pear crop and 41 per cent of a normal apple crop. This prediction for pears will be materially cut down by a canvass of the Sacramento pear district where the loss is variously estimated by growers and shippers at from 500 to 700 cars.

The data of the bureau is especially interesting to the Rogue River growers in that it shows that nearly 80 per cent of the apples in the country are northwestern bud apples. Washington, Idaho, Oregon and California have practically full crops, while New York and the Virginia are light except in certain limited areas. The middle western states from Michigan to the Ozarks are practically a blank, the government experts say.

Present indications are that the crop will return considerably in excess of \$2,000,000 to the growers here this year. This estimate is based upon apples bringing \$1000 per car and pears from \$900 to \$1500 per car.

Prospects for high prices for Rogue River pears, particularly Bartletts, were never better at this season, according to the opinion of resident shippers.

This prediction is based upon the general crop failure throughout the middle western and eastern districts and the short crop in California. While there was a fair crop—about 75 per cent of normal—in the Sacramento river section in California, a month ago, the tonnage from that district was cut down from 30 to 40 per cent by a young cyclone which swept through the valley July 4. Galesville-Wolf Creek, 14 miles: Paving in progress at both ends of job; where detours are not available traffic will be allowed to pass at least every two hours.
Wolf Creek-Grave Creek, 5 miles Paved.
Grave Creek-Grants Pass, 18 miles: Being macadamized; take old road at summit of Smith hill; good condition when dry. From the foot of Smith hill to Grants Pass it is no longer necessary to detour via Merwin. The main highway can be used except when a short detour is used.
Grants Pass-Gold Hill, 18 miles: Paved; a detour might be necessary at the Sardinia creek bridge which is being rebuilt.
Gold Hill-Ashland, 27 miles: Paved.
Ashland-California line, 22 miles: Paved, except a half mile stretch on the summit of the Siskiyou's.
Crater Lake Highway
The Crater Lake road is now open to the lake. Due to excessive dust from Dodge bridge to the ferry, the route from Medford to Eagle Point, thence via Reese Creek school house to McLeod bridge is to be preferred.
