# ESPEE OFFICIAL PREDICTS 1300

EXPECT THIRTY PER CENT IN. San Francisco Bay district. -CANNERIES ARE ACTIVE.

1300 cars of apples will be shipped ture home in Berkeley, Calif. from the Rogue River district and the Umpqua valley this season, according to conservative estimates The Square Deal announced here today by I. T Sparks, district freight and passenger agent for the Southern Pacific company.

The apple movement will be 30 per cent greater than that of 1920. and the pear shipment, which was expected to be only 85 per cent of last year's movement, will equal the 1920 shipments.

According to A. T. Mercier, superintendent of the Portland division. who was here today, all of the shipments made thus far have moved on schedule time or better. The record from the Oregon territory to Ogden, the eastern terminal of the Southern Pacific lines, is considered a fine tribute to the efficiency of the railroad.

The shipment of the new vegetable -brocolli, from this district will aggregate 75 or 80 cars. Twenty-five cars of fresh prunes have been shipped, and this is expected to grow into a considerable importance.
