News from the Other Side of the Atlantic.

Minister Hirsch Awake.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Feb. 13. At the request of Sol. Hirsch, American minister, the Porte has imprisoned in his palace Moussa Bey, the Kurdish chief. who is charged with robbing and outraging Christians in Armenia. The charges will be investigated, and it is possible that the chief may lose his head-not merely in the official sense as the term goes at Washington, but the head that grows his hair and beard.

International Labor Conference.

Paris, Feb. 13. - The German invitation to the French government to participate in the labor conference was considered by the cabinet to-day, and it was voted to instruct minister Ichuller to make further inquiries concerning the character and scope of the conference before replying.

British War Vessel Stranded.

London, Feb. 13. - A dispatch from Zanzibar says the British corvette "Conquest" is stranded on the island of Pembina in a dangerous position.

A Dead Sultan.

London, Feb. 13.—It is reported that the Sultan of Zanzibar is dead.

Another Parnell Triumph.

London, Feb. 14.—Thomas Power O'Connor's paper, the Star, asserts today that the report of the Parnell investigating commission appointed by Parliament is a trinniphant acquittal of all the Parnellite members of the House of Commons, of the charges that had been laid against them.

A Forger Sentenced.

London, Feb. 14.—Dispatches from Nice state that Benson, the American, otherwise known as "Jabilee Jugglins," who was arrested for the forgery of a check for £1000 and whose friends had, it was said, made the loss good, has been sentenced to three months imprisonment, and to pay the costs of
