Program: (a) Thursdays--Arithmetic, Writing, History, and Civil Government. (b) Fridays -- Grammar, Physiology, Geography, and Spelling. 3. Sources of Questions: (a) Civil Government --United States Constitution. (b) Geography -- State Course of Study: Redway and Hinman's Natural School Geography. (c) History--List of topics from History Outline in State Course of Study and Current Events. (d) Language--Buehler's Modern English Grammar, no diagramming. (e) Reading -- The teacher will send to the County Superintendent the applicant's class standing in reading, which shall be taken by such superintendent as the applicant's standing on the subject. (f) Spelling -- Eighty per cent from Read's Word Lessons, and twenty per cent, from manuscript in Language.
