## FREIGHT RECEIPTS MAY BE VALUABLE

oid rates have therefore been collected by the railroad company.

The United States court has sustained the demurrer of the commission to the railroad company's bill of complaint and has denied the railroad company's application for a temporary writ of injunction. However, the railroad company has filed an

amended bill of complaint, to which the commission has filed a demurrer, and the court has continued the restraining order in force pending the hearing upon the demurrer to the amended complaint. The court has stated that probably the demurrer cannot be heard before some time in January, 1910.

We wish to urge upon your readers the necessity of preserving with care all receipted freight bills evidencing payments of any freight moving between Portland and points east of The Dalles, over the lines of the Oregon Railroad & Navigation company since May 12, 190. When the controversy is finally determined if the order of the commission is sustained, many thousands of dollars will be found to be subject to the terms of the bond, and the O. R. & N. company will be compelled to make restitution. Without these receipted bills it will be difficult for shippers or consignees who have paid excess charges to establish their claims for reparation.

Please urge your readers to preserve with care all receipted freight bills whatsoever which may possibly be affected by the order until the controversy is determined, when they can be examined and it can be determined whether they come within the provisions of the order. These freight bills may mean money, and they should not be lost or destroyed.
