Directly south from the canal is a coast line of five thousand miles, reaching from Panama to Patagonia, upon which practically debouch Colombia, Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia and Chile, all countries of vast potentialities and conducting now in their isolated location an annual foreign commerce valued at three hundred million dollars.
The canal, opened, will MAKE THIS GROW IN TEN YEARS COST OF THE CANAL. Northwest from the canal, or from Panama to San Diego, is another coast line of three thousand miles upon
which debouch the five Central American republics and Mexieo and a foreign trade worth now one bundred million dollars. There are, then, in short, eight thousand miles of resourceful coast line now
