New Bank Opens For Business

Enterprise State Bank And Its Strong Local and Eastern Backing.

The Enterprise State bank opened for business Tuesday morning, in its temporary quarters in the Daniel Lloyd brick building on West Main street. Cashier W. C. Hinterman is in charge.

The new bank, as it is generally called, is a strong combination of local and Eastern capital, 17 of the 27 stockholders residing in the county. The capital stock is \$25,000. The bank has particularly strong Eastern backing, some of its stockholders being officers of the Continental & Commercial National bank of Chicago, the largest financial institution west of New York.

Mr. Hinterman, the cashier, came here from Salt Lake City, where he had been assistant cashier of the Continental National bank. Prior to that connection he was with the Commercial National of Chicago for 12 years, being chief clerk in that big bank.
