Publication of Unpaid Taxes By Sheriff As Directed By Law, and Order of County Court.

Notice of Sheriff's Sale for Delinquent Taxes for the year 1906.

Notice is hereby given that by virtue of a warrant for the collection of delinquent taxes for the year 1906 commanding me to sell the several articles of personal property or parcels of real property mentioned and described in the delinquent tax list for said year, issued out of and under the seal of the County Court of the State of Oregon, for the county of Wallowa, bearing date the 19th day of December 1907, and to me as sheriff directed and delivered, I will between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon on the 8th day of February 1908, at my office in the court house in the City of Enterprise, Wallowa county, Oregon, sell for cash at public auction, to the person who offers to pay the taxes, costs, and accruing penalties thereon, and take a certificate at the lowest rate of interest, not exceeding ten per cent, each of the following described parcels of real property, situated in Wallowa County, Oregon, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to satisfy the amount of taxes, costs and accruing penalties thereon, to wit:

'Tis reported that Wallowa people are in favor of building a court house. In fact nearly everybody says it's time the county had a decent place for holding court, transacting public business and storage of public documents and records. There is a slight difference as to the exact location of the building that June will wipe out.

Friends from all parts of the county are urging J. A. French to run for county judge. He sure would know the job and where economies could be practiced in the interest of the taxpayers.

Registration is slow at the clerk's office, only No. 94 being reached Monday. 'Tis said more than that number have registered already with Squire Austin at Flora.

The Ramsey letter is the sensation of the day. There's lots of inquiry about it. Its effect in this county remains to be seen.

There is much street talk at Joseph of trying to induce Judge J. B. Olmsted to run for county judge on the Republican ticket. Mr. Olmsted filled the position a number of years ago.

C. R. Eberhard, the well known young attorney at Joseph, will be a candidate for the Republican nomination for representative in the legislature. Mr. Eberhard will sign statement No. 1, pledging himself to vote for the popular choice for U. S. senator.

J. W. Kerns, the popular superintendent of county schools, has been so busy with school matters that he hasn't had time to send out his petitions for nomination for sheriff on the Republican ticket, but will start them over the county in a day or two.

F. A. Reavis has out petitions for nomination for county treasurer on the Democratic ticket. He is the present incumbent of that position and if absence of all criticism of the conduct of the office is a criterion he has filled the bill satisfactorily.

J. C. Conley, principal of the Joseph schools, is asking for the Republican nomination for the office of county superintendent of schools. Few if any men are better known in the county, as Mr. Conley formerly filled the position to which he now seeks re-election. He is evidently not afraid of his record, and that's a pretty good recommend.

H. N. Williams, of near Lostine, the well known farmer and ex-county commissioner, was in Enterprise a short time Saturday. Mr. Williams has decided to make the race for the nomination on the Democratic ticket for the office of county judge. He served two terms on the court as commissioner. In a short interview with a News Record representative Mr. Williams said he believed in making a levy just large enough to pay the expenses of the county, economically administered. He is also in favor of building a court house of moderate cost. A suitable building could be put up he thinks for about \$20,000.
