## Notes From The Political Field

Oregon Scout: D. W. Sheahan of Enterprise announces himself a democratic candidate for the office of District Judge. Mr. Sheahan had a large number of increments for the appointment when this district was created. The judge is well known to our people having studied his profession in the law office of J. W. Shelton over twenty years ago. He has an extensive law practice in Wallowa county and has been established there longer than any other attorney. In his petition he declares that if elected he will administer the affairs of the office impartially, speedily and economically for both counties without regard to his own personal convenience.

J. B. Olmsted has petitions out for the Republican nomination for county judge. He is a well known farmer residing between Enterprise and Joseph and is a brother-in-law of F. D. McCully. It is rumored another Joseph man and a Wallowa man of prominence will come out for commissioner.

Thos. Rich who is seeking the Democratic nomination for assessor, is postmaster at Fruita and a fruit raiser and cattelman who is well known over the county from his school teaching days. Tom has lots of friends who will aid him in his candidacy.

Frank V. Bowman of Joseph is a young man said to be thoroughly qualified for the office of sheriff. He is a candidate for the Republican nomination for that office, and has a business-like way of going about it that indicates the other fellows will know they have been in a race.

The great North Country is asking for a place on the Republican ticket for C. H. Allen as nominee for assessor. Mr. Allen is principal of the Flora schools and has very decided opinions on the question of assessing. His platform is a square deal for all.

Arthur H. Rudd is the only candidate so far for the Republican nomination for surveyor. He is a young man of ability in his chosen profession, a graduate of splendid engineering schools, and has been in demand since locating in this county both for land and mining survey work.

C. J. Yager of Lost Prairie, who was in Enterprise a few weeks ago, knows from experience what a county seat fight means and he hopes Wallowa county will be spared the affliction, which is worse than recurring blight on crops or a deadly epidemic among live stock. Mr. Yager came to Wallowa county 25 years ago from Hancock county, Illinois. Hancock is the largest and most fertile county of all the wonderfully rich shires that border the Mississippi river between Quincy

The apportionment for the Democratic state convention that meets in Portland, June 16, is one delegate for each 250 votes or fraction over 125, cast for Governor George E. Chamberlain at the June election, 1906. This gives the following representation to Eastern Oregon: Baker 10, Crook 4, Gilliam 3, Grant 4, Harney 3, Klamath 3, Lake 2, Malheur 4, Morrow 3, Sherman 2, Umatilla 8, Union, Wallowa 4, Wasco 7, Wheeler 2. The total number is 214, of which Multnomah will have 38.

Wm. F. Eisenbeis of Joseph has out petitions for the Republican nomination for county treasurer.

## FILES PAPERS AT SALEM

Judge J. W. Knowles has filed with the secretary of state his declaration of intention to become a candidate for the republican nomination of circuit judge of the Tenth Judicial district, at the primary election to be held April 17. He announces as his declaration of principles that, if elected, he will faithfully and impartially perform the duties of the office, and that he favors a rigid enforcement of all laws.—La Grande Observer.

### Election Information.

The filing of initiative petitions, nominating petitions, pamphlets, etc., for the general and primary elections this spring, is of great importance, and in order that no one may be caught napping, the secretary of the state's office has dug out some information and compiled it in such a way that it is able to be understood.

The primary election will be held April 17 and the general election June 1.

According to the secretary of state, compilation proceedings under initiative petitions must have 7465 signatures; initiative petitions must be filed by January 31; arguments advocating measures must be filed by February 3; person filing argument must pay cost of paper and printing; initiative measure must be printed by the secretary of state by March 2; secretary of state must make up the form of ballot by May 4.

Candidates for state and district offices and district attorneys must file with the secretary of state at the time of beginning to circulate petitions a copy of the petition as evidence that said elector is a candidate for nomination by his party. The vote cast by a political party in each voting precinct for representative in congress at the last preceding general election is the basis on which the percentage for petitions shall be counted and need not exceed 1000 signers.

Petitions for nomination for office to be voted for in the state at large must be signed by at least two per cent of the party electors.

Petitions for nomination for offices to be voted for in only one county or district, shall be filed with the county clerk not less than 15 days before the date of the primary election. Primary elections will be held Friday, April 17.

### Printing Office Rules.

Parties wishing to enter the printing office at this season of the year should be governed by the following rules:

Advance to the inner door, give three distinct raps and the devil will tend to your alarm. You will give your name, postoffice address and the number of years you are owing the paper; he will admit you. You will advance to the center of the office and address the editor with the following countersign: Extend your right hand about two feet from your body, with the thumb and index finger clasping a \$0 bill, which drop into the extended hand of the editor, at the same time saying: "Were you looking for me?" The editor will say: "You bet." After giving him the news you will be permitted to retire with a receipt for an obligation properly discharged.—Exchange.
